

Money from the Government for Sports Support 2016 - 2017

Employment of a TA who is a Qualified Sports Coach

We employ a TA, who is a qualified sports coach, to deliver some PE and Sports teaching. He teaches all of the year groups across the school. He works to the timetable and long term plans, which have been planned with the teacher responsible for PE and Sport, to ensure the children have a balanced programme across the year. His role is to work closely with the PE coordinator to deliver lessons and to ensure that the opportunities and quality of experience is high quality. The TA also supports the teachers in developing their own skills in delivering this subject. Extracurricular clubs at lunchtime and after school are offered in several sports. He accompanies the children to matches when possible and supports the teachers as needed in the delivery of PE and Sport.

Swimming

Support is given to ensure that all children from Year 2 to Year 6 have the opportunity to attend swimming. The money supports payment for all children to attend as it is subsidised. It also supports payment for the three swimming coaches who ensure that the coaching is of a high quality.

Transport costs

Use of the minibus for children to attend sports fixtures out of school is supported by money from PE Sports Funding. The donations made by the parents in supporting this resource are small so funding is used to subsidise costs.
